Marine debris poses a significant navigational hazard because it entangles rudders and propellers and clogs vessel intakes, resulting in engine failure. Keeping Narragansett Bay waters safe and navigable is important for commercial and recreational transportation in the state. The total cost would be \$7,000,000 with a federal share of 65 percent and a non-federal share of 35 percent.

The Corps' current authorities limit the ability of local governments to tackle waterfront development projects comprehensibly.
