For the congressionally directed spending item, the name and location of the intended recipient or, if there is no specifically intended recipient, the intended location of the activity:
The University of Rhode Island Transportation Center (URITC), Kingston, RI.
The purpose of the congressionally directed spending item:
The URITC was established in 1999 under the Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century
(TEA-21). The URITC conducts multidisciplinary education, research, technology transfer,
and outreach for surface transportation systems and advanced transportation infrastructure.
TEA-21 required University Transport Centers to match federal funding. URITC, on average,
received \$1.6 million, which it matched dollar for dollar. SAFETEA reauthorized the University
Transport Centers Program. In SAFETEA, URITC was designated a Tier II Center and currently
receives \$500,000 under the program. SAFETEA requires, however, URITC to maintain its previou
effort, plus match the current level of federal funds dollar for dollar, requiring URITC to match
funds it no longer receives. We request a technical correction to SAFETEA that would require
Tier II Centers to match only the amount of the award actually provided under SAFETEA.
