Dear Member of the United States House of Representatives:

As organizations representing nearly every aspect of the American economy, we urge you to support passage of the H.R. 2576, the Frank R. Lautenberg Chemical Safety for the 21st Century Act, legislation to reform U.S. chemical regulation by updating the 1976 Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA).

The Frank R. Lautenberg Chemical Safety for the 21st Century Act is a historic opportunity for Congress to pass legislation that protects public health and the environment, while preserving America's place as a leading innovator of transformational new products and materials. This carefully-crafted bipartisan legislation is the product of a multi-year effort to balance the interests and input of a broad array of stakeholders in order to create a strong 21st-century chemicals management system.

As representatives of producers and users of chemicals—as raw materials, ingredients for finished products, and essential elements for industrial processes—reforming TSCA is a priority for each of our organizations. H.R. 2576 will provide a strong and clear unified national regulatory system and the kind of certainty American businesses need to invest, grow, and create jobs.

TSCA reform has received strong support in Congress, with the House passing H.R. 2576, the “TSCA Modernization Act of 2015,” last summer by a near-unanimous vote and the Senate passing complementary legislation without objection in December. We are deeply appreciative of the hard work and commitment of House leadership, the House Energy and Commerce Committee, and both of their staffs for finding an agreement between the two bills that meets the needs of consumers; manufacturers and retailers; environmental, public health, and animal rights advocates; and organized labor.

Congress is within reach of a major victory on behalf of American families and the American economy. Please help bring this important effort across the finish line by voting in favor of H.R. 2576, the Frank R. Lautenberg Chemical Safety for the 21st Century Act, when it comes to the House floor.
